
Supporting Tribal communities as they Prepare for Climate Impacts



Modernize programs to support climate-resilient investments:
Agencies will examine their policies and programs and find ways to make it easier for cities and towns to build smarter and stronger.

Manage lands and waters for climate preparedness and resilience:
America's natural resources are critical to our Nation's economy, health and quality of life.

Provide information, data and tools for climate change preparedness and resilience:
Scientific data and insights to provide a better understanding and manage the risks associated with extreme weather and other impacts of climate change.

Plan for climate change related risk:
Federal agencies must develop and implement strategies to evaluate and address their most significant climate change related risks.

Supporting Tribal Resilience in Indian Country

Tribes throughout the U.S. are already experiencing the impacts of a changing climate including drought, intensifying wildfires, changes in plants and animals important to subsistence and cultural practices, impacts to treaty and trust resources, and coastal erosion and sea level rise.
