



Twin Buttes Replacement School Being Readied in North Dakota

OFMC funded the replacement Twin Buttes Day School. The new K-8 school will be dedicated later this year.

OFMC is finishing the replacement Twin Buttes Day School in North Dakota. The 24,471 square foot school will serve up to 80 students in grades K-8, mostly members of the Three Affiliated Tribes. Official dedication is expected later this year.

Seven existing school buildings will be demolished or removed after the new school is occupied. The main Indian Affairs-owned school building, which will be demolished, was built in 1954. Two other Indian Affairs-owned buildings, built in the 1970's, and four tribally owned buildings, built in the 1980's, are all modular classroom buildings, scheduled to be demolished or removed.



A new Four Bears monument will be constructed near the school's entrance, a Fighting Eagle sculpture will accent the cafeteria (visible to the main entrance lobby), and an Eagle logo will be painted on the north gym wall.
