

**Cook Inlet Tribal Council**  
**FY14 Unemployment Insurance Records**

Cook Inlet Tribal Council (CITC) submitted a list of participants who entered unsubsidized employment to the State of Alaska. The State processed the list, attempting to match each participant to an unemployment insurance (UI) record.

# of CITC participants who entered unsubsidized employment in FY14	777
# entered in the State of Alaska UI records in FY14	700
# not entered in the State of Alaska UI records in FY14	77
% of CITC participants who entered unsubsidized employment and entered in the State of Alaska UI records in FY14	91%

The number of participants who were not able to be matched with a UI record can be attributed to: employers who waited the 90 days allowed by law to enter the employee into the system and thus entered the employee too late to be matched by the State; self-employment; as well as employers who were not required to participate.

This information was made possible by a memorandum of agreement with the State of Alaska. It was developed for use by CITC's Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program and expanded to include 477 federal reporting requirements.

Cook Inlet Tribal Council is proud of the results and looks forward to continuing to partner with our participants to achieve their employment goals. The greatest challenge to this mission is decreased federal funding.
