## Dear Tribal Leader:

The Department of the Interior (Department) is examining ways it could reorganize to improve efficiency, effectiveness, and accountability in line with President Donald J. Trump Executive Order 13781, signed on March 13, 2017. Secretary Ryan K. Zinke recently announced his vision to establish 13 unified regional office boundaries across all of the Department's Bureaus. Currently the Department's 10 Bureaus operate in 40 distinct regions, each with unique boundaries. Establishing uniform boundaries would facilitate sharing of resources and encourage a shared frame of geographic reference, resulting in operational and administrative efficiencies.

The Department is taking careful consideration on how our Indian Affairs regions and functions may be included in this reorganization. Your input is critical to our efforts and I invite you to consult on how to implement the principles of efficiency, effectiveness, and accountability in a manner that substantially improves services to the Tribes and Tribal citizens across Indian Country. This is an opportunity to shape the Department for the next 100 years, to provide long-term, meaningful benefit for all, including Tribes and Indian Affairs.

I will be kicking off this consultation period with a listening session on Sunday, June 3, 2018, at 1:00 p.m. CDT, at the National Congress of American Indians Mid-Year conference in Kansas City, Missouri. I also invite you to attend one of the following formal consultation sessions:
