THE BIA TRIBAL RESILIENCE PROGRAM (TRP) PROVIDES RESOURCES SPANNING ACROSS INDIAN COUNTRY, TO FEDERALLY-RECOGNIZED TRIBAL NATIONS AND ALASKA NATIVE VILLAGES. THESE RESOURCES HELP TRIBES BUILD RESILIENCE THROUGH LEADERSHIP ENGAGEMENT, DELIVERY OF DATA AND TOOLS, TRAINING AND TRIBAL CAPACITY BUILDING.

Tribal Resilience Program Provides:

Federal wide resources to Tribal Nations and Alaska Native Villages to:

- Build capacity and resilience through both financial and technical assistance
- Support delivery of data and tools
- Provide access to training and workshops
- Facilitate planning associated with harmful environmental change impacts



Direct funding supports tribes, tribal consortia, and authorized tribal organizations to build resilience through competitive awards for tribally designed:

- capacity building and resilience training
- supplemental monitoring
- vulnerability and risk assessments
- climate adaptation planning
- ocean and coastal planning
- relocation, managed retreat, or protect-in-place planning

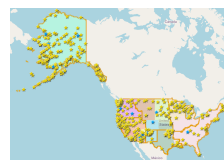

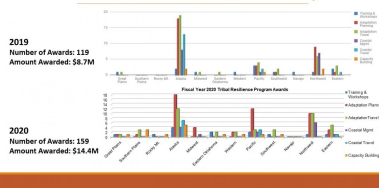

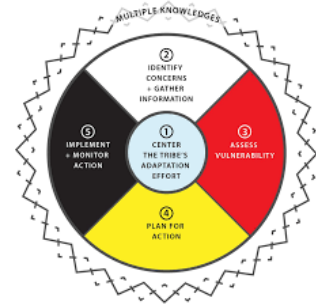
TRP partners with the Institute for Tribal Environmental Professional's (ITEP) **Tribes and Climate Change Program** to provide climate training to tribes nationwide.
