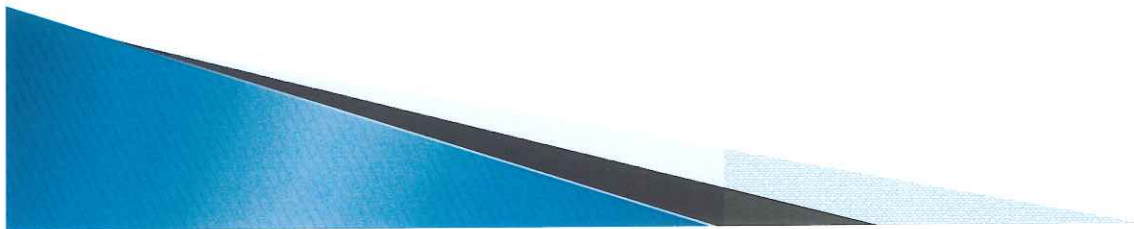

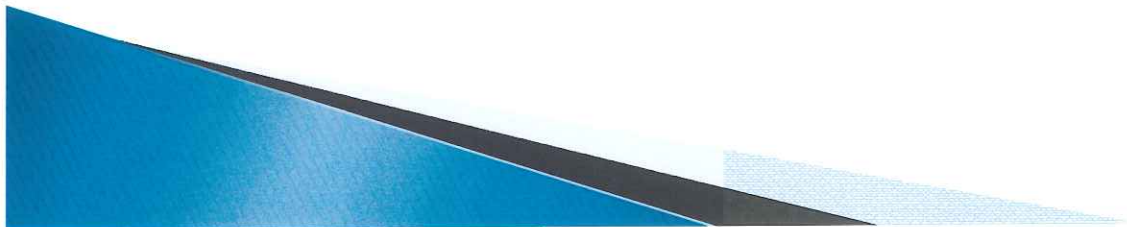
Current Backlog total numbers

- ▶ Estimated at \$18,040,345.00 (*see N33-13*)
- ▶ FCI currently at 1.2139. cost exceeds original building cost
- ▶ OM and MI & R is not sufficient to correct backlog and correct safety deficiencies
- ▶ 67 items address Uniform building code improvement/repairs
- ▶ 5 outstanding National Fire Codes–NFPA compliance no sprinkler systems in bldg.
- ▶ Continuous notice of unsafe and unhealthful working conditions safety reports...*2016*



Staff and students adapted over decades of it's Educational Facilities

- ▶ Plants growing within wall structure due to the current foundation.
- ▶ Kitchen dry storage building has plants/trees enrooted into the current foundation.
- ▶ Sand seeps through dry food storage
- ▶ Non compliance of electrical code
- ▶ Half of the education building has exposure of building separation of structure in the lower grade levels.
- ▶ Technology deficiencies: not meeting needs of student/staff computer computers, equipment's not up to par, breaker panels not equip to uphold infrastructures even to implement Spring PARCC state assessment.

- ▶ 3 Navajo Nation Headstart (Cow Springs & Tonalea 1 & 2)
- ▶ Route 16 (White Mesa, Route 62-60/62-70)
 - Average driving distance to 70 miles in am/pm
- ▶ Western Tonalea Special Need Schools
 - Travel distance of up to 50 miles as per child's Individualized Education Plan as dictated by the Committee of Special Education—average of 24 IEP students.

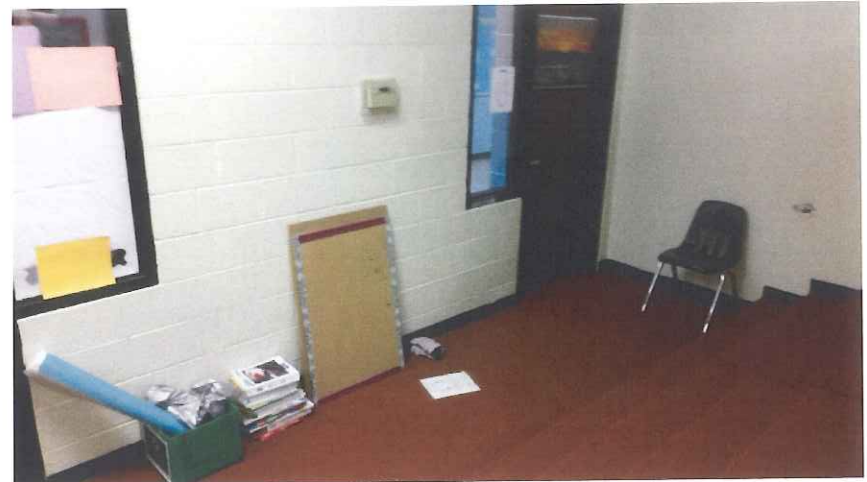

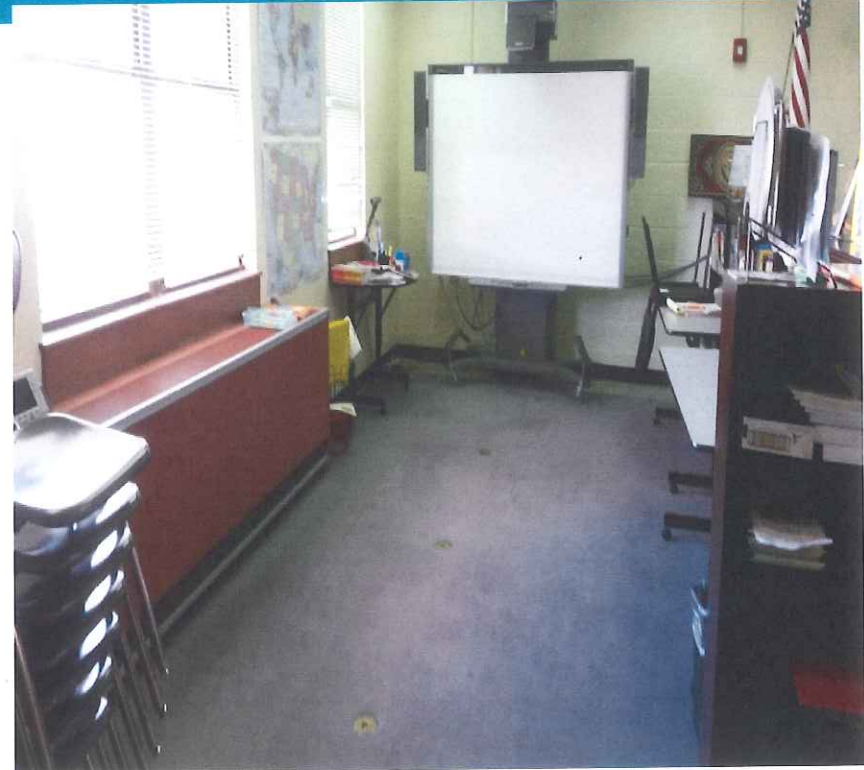

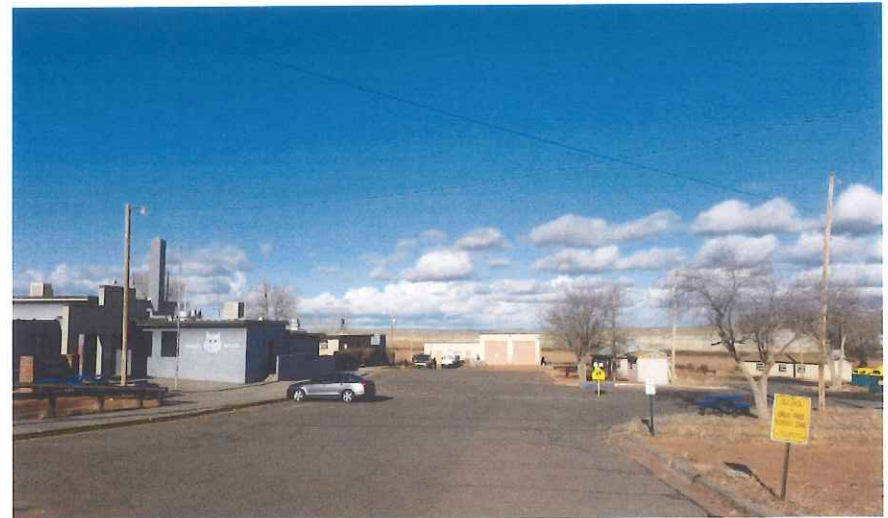
