Dear Mr. Cason:

We write today on behalf of the more than 650,000 citizens of the Cherokea Chickasaw. Choctaw, Muscogee (Creek), and Seminole Nations to respectfully request that the scheduled consultations and listening sessions regarding a reorganization of the Department of the Interior ("Tribal Listening Sessions on E.O. 13871: Reorganization of the Executive Branch") occur prior to any further Department action on this mitiative.

In a May 16 letter to tribal leaders, Acting AS-IA Michael Black requested input on how the Department ... could be reorganized to help streamline services to tribes and better fulfill the Federal Government's trust and treaty responsibilities." The letter invited tribes to share their views at one of six listening sessions.

It was quite discouraging to learn that the Department may have already begun what the Washington Post deemed a "broad reorganization." The paper reported that Secretary Zinke is reassigning "three dozen or more" senior career officials, including Acting ASIA Black and BIA Director Bruce Loudermilk.

In order for our tribes to continue to work effectively with the federal government, it is imperative that tribal leader input is considered before action is taken on reorganization or the reassignment of key personnel. The federal government has trust obligations to tribes, and Interior agencies fulfill that obligation. It is deeply concerning if tribal leader voices are not being considered when major changes are proposed.

It is equally concerning that the Department may look to disrupt activities at BIA regional offices across the United States. The tribes in eastern Oklahoma have developed an effective and cooperative government-to-government relationship with Regional Director Eddie Streater and his staff. The office structure enables us to process claims and address critical issues with haste, and as you know, timely communications and services support the livelihood of our citizens.

As tribal leaders, we are continuously seeking improved efficiencies within our tribal governments. We share this goal with the Department. That is why we urge you to allow the consultations and listening sessions to conclude before moving forward with

reorganization. This will help perpetuate an environment of cooperation and partnership, enabling us to work effectively together.
