

- Liaisons are housed at and work with the DOI's Climate Adaptation Science Centers (CASCs)
- Connecting Tribal needs and priorities to information, data, tools and expertise at the CASCs
- Facilitate and support adaptation and resilience planning and implementation

















- Can turn layers on or off to see different BIA Regions, Tribal Liaison Regions, or TRP awards





