# 1. Purpose and Need for the Proposed Action

EOG Resources, Inc. (EOG) is proposing to drill a Three Forks Formation oil and gas well on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation to evaluate and possibly develop the commercial potential of natural resources. Developments have been proposed on land held in trust by the United States in McKenzie County, North Dakota. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) is the surface management agency for potentially affected tribal lands and individual allotments. The BIA also holds title to subsurface mineral rights. The economic development of available resources and associated BIA actions are consistent with BIA's general mission. Leasing and development of mineral resources offers substantial economic benefits to the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara Nation and to individual tribal members.

The purpose of the proposed action is to authorize EOG to drill a second well (Mandaree 108-15H) to explore the potential of the Three Forks Formation, on the approved Mandaree 04-15H well pad.

# 2. Authorities

Oil and gas exploration and development activities are conducted under authority of the Indian Mineral Leasing Act of 1938 (25 United States Code [USC] 396a, et seq.), the Indian Mineral Development Act of 1982 (25 USC 2101, et seq.), and the Energy Policy Act of 2005 (42 USC 15801, et seq.).

## 3. Legal Land Description for Proposed Action

The well pad is located 2 miles southwest of Mandaree, North Dakota, in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 15, Township 149 North, Range 94 West, McKenzie County, North Dakota (Figure 1). The proposed Mandaree 108-15H well will have a bottom hole located approximately 4,600 feet north and 1,430 feet west of the surface location, in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 15, Township 149 North, Range 94 West, McKenzie County.

## 4. Scope of Work for Proposed Action

EOG proposes to drill a second well, which will enter the Three Forks Formation, on the approved Mandaree 04-15H well pad. There will be no additional surface disturbance to the existing well pad or access road.

## 5. **Resource Surveys**

SWCA Environmental Consultants (SWCA) conducted a cultural resource inventory of this well pad and associated access road using an intensive pedestrian methodology Approximately 33.92 acres were inventoried for the well pad on September 14, 2009 (Higgins 2009<sup>1</sup>). Two cultural resource sites were newly recorded within the APE of the proposed Mandaree 04-15H well pad. One prehistoric cairn site and one prehistoric stone feature site

were located during the inventory of Mandaree 04-15H well pad. The stone feature and cairn sites are potential TCPs and avoidance was recommended until the sites could be further evaluated for NRHP eligibility. During the surveys for Mandaree 04-15H, the well pad location was moved to avoid the sites and establish appropriate setbacks. Fencing was used utilized to maintain appropriate setbacks from the features and the recommended avoidance was implemented and followed. No cultural resources were adversely effected during the construction of the well pad.

SWCA conducted natural resource surveys for threatened and endangered species, migratory birds, bald and golden eagles, and wetlands on September 14, 2009. Representatives from the BIA and Bureau of Land Management were present during the site visit. No protected species were observed during the survey.

# 6. Applicable National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Document(s)

Environmental Assessment: EOG Resources, Inc. Proposed Nine Exploratory Wells: Mandaree 02-09H, Mandaree 04-15H, Mandaree 05-16H, Mandaree 06-20H, Mandaree 12-07H, Bear Den 08-21H, Clarks Creek 01-21H, Clarks Creek 03-08H, and Riverview 01-32H 1H (January 2010).

# 7. NEPA Adequacy Criteria

This document has identified the above-mentioned previously prepared NEPA document, which adequately describes the environmental consequences of the newly proposed action described herein, and meets the following NEPA Adequacy Criteria.

- 1. The proposed action is substantially the same action and at the site specifically analyzed in the existing NEPA document.
- 2. The range of alternatives is reasonable with respect to the current proposed action in the existing NEPA document, which appropriately considers and analyzes current environmental concerns, interests, and resource values.
- 3. The existing analysis and conclusions are adequate in the existing NEPA document. The analysis is still valid in light of new studies or resource assessment information.
- 4. The methodology and analytical approach used in the existing NEPA document continues to be appropriate for the proposed action.
- 5. The direct and indirect impacts of the proposed action are unchanged from those identified in the existing NEPA document.
- 6. The cumulative impacts that would result from implementation of the proposed action are unchanged from those analyzed in the existing NEPA document.
- 7. A 30-day comment period involving public input and interagency review was used in the development of the existing NEPA document.
