Verification of Wildland Fire Use Statistics

Requests for agency-specific data for the Wildland Fire Use (WFU) program are becoming more frequent, and each of the Federal fire agencies is working to ensure its statistics are accurate and consistent among the multiple sources of this information. Our Wildland Fire Use program is small, but it is important that we strive for an accurate and reliable historical record of wildland fire use in Indian Country.

The Wildland Fire Use Statistics (attached) is current information that the Bureau of Indian Affairs, National Interagency Fire Center (BIA-NIFC) houses. BIA-NIFC has attempted to correct the available data and make it consistent between the three primary sources of wildland fire occurrence information—the National Situation Report maintained by the National Interagency Coordination Center, the National Fire Plan Operations and Reporting System (NFPORS), and the Wildland Fire Management Information system (WFMI). All wildland fire use incidents reported through any one of these sources for the past eleven years were examined to determine if the incident met the criteria for wildland fire use; namely, the fire was naturally-ignited, the hosting unit's Fire Management Plan allowed for wildland fire use, and the incident was managed under a Wildland Fire Implementation Plan (WFIP).

BIA-NIFC is requesting your region's assistance in further refining the accuracy of this information. Much of the information used to correct the data was obtained by making contact with reporting entities and eliminating fires that were miscoded as WFU, but the information may not be complete—specifically, there may be additional WFU incidents in Indian Country that do not appear in any of the information sources consulted.

# Wildland Fire Use Statistics for Indian Country 1997-2007

Issue: Requests for agency-specific data for the Wildland Fire Use (WFU) program are becoming more frequent. Searching the available sources for BIA wildland fire use statistics yields conflicting and often inaccurate results that are not supported by closer examination of the data source and direct contact with reporting entities.
