


National Drug Threat Summary



120 people die daily due to drug overdose

Prescription drugs result in more overdoses than heroin and cocaine combined

Meth distribution and abuse contributes to violent and property crime rates






Cocaine distributors seek out meth users as alternative drug

Synthetic designer drug threat impacts many areas of the country




Greatest Drug Threat 2007-2015









Greatest Drug Threat Nationally 2013-2015




Drugs trafficked to Indian Country...



- Mexican DTOs control transportation and marijuana, cocaine, and powder and ice methamphetamine to criminal groups, gang members, and independent traffickers within and outside Native American communities in the Southwest Region..

Drugs trafficked to Indian Country...



- Mexican traffickers routinely smuggle drugs through reservation border areas en route to U.S. drug markets.
- Methamphetamine and marijuana are the most widely abused drugs on reservations throughout the region.





Drug Trafficking Organizations...



Meth is trafficked primarily from Mexico into the United States by Mexican Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTOs)

Mexican DTOs and **Native American DTOs** target Indian Reservations and also utilize them as drug hubs and trafficking routes.

Indian Youth Gangs continues to increase on Reservations and in Federal and State prison





- Hispanic Gangs(Barrrio Aztecas, Nortenos, Surenyos)



Show me the Money!!!



1 pound of methamphetamine at Southwest Border \$4,000 and 90% pure

1 pound of methamphetamine in Wyoming \$10,000 and 90% pure

1 pound of methamphetamine cut to 2 pounds 45% pure

2 pounds of methamphetamine cut to 32 packages, 1 ounce each (\$1,000/ounce) \$32,000 and 45% pure

32 packages, 1 ounce each out to 906 packages, 1 gram each (\$100/gram) \$90,600-45% pure



74% of law enforcement identified meth as the greatest drug threat



What's on the mind of Tribal Youth? (2008, OJJDP)

10 to 14-year-old youth responses to questions about their community and school

	Yes	No
Do you feel safe in your community?	50%	50%
Are your peers using alcohol and drugs?	100%	0%
Are there gangs in your school?	42%	58%
Do you feel safe in school?	25%	75%

Additional Problems



Impaired cognitive functioning and short-term memory loss, notably abstract thinking and judgment

A person's ability to perceive risks while tweaking is diminished (person may engage in high risk sexual behavior linked to HIV infection and syphilis)

Mixing drugs when crashing: Vicadin, Hydrocodone, Oxycodone and Methadone

30% San Carlos Tribal employees tested positive for meth.



Collaborative Partnerships





- Early Intervention:** reduce risk factors: drug abusing peers, aggressive behavior, poor self-control
- Community Education:** PSA's, billboards, videos, pamphlets, Anti-drug events
- Family Based Programs:** parenting skills, family policies, enhanced family bonding
- School Based Programs:** Grammar, Middle and High School specific
- Drug Court Program:** actively handled adult and juvenile drug cases as coordinated with child custody by social services
