The BIA must first certify that the indigent Indian parent/custodian is eligible to have his or her appointed counsel compensated by the BIA, and may deny certification for any of the reasons stated in 25 C.F.R. § 23.13(b).

Within ten (10) days of receiving a completed form, the BIA Regional Director will notify the court, the client, and the attorney in writing whether the indigent Indian parent/custodian has

been certified as eligible to have his or her attorney fees and expenses paid by the BIA. The BIA Regional Director's failure to respond within this 10-day period shall be deemed a denial of eligibility pursuant to 25 C.F.R. § 23.13(g).

The BIA Regional Director's denial of an indigent Indian parent/custodian's eligibility to have his or her attorney fees and expenses paid by the BIA may be appealed to the Assistant Secretary – Indian Affairs in accordance with the procedures set out in 25 C.F.R. Part 2.
