- **Opportunity to automatically convert to a full-time position after graduation**

### PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

#### Pathways Internship Program Participants must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Be accepted or enrolled in an accredited college, university, or technical school; Tribal College and University (TCU) students are highly encouraged to apply!
- Maintain part-time or full-time student status (i.e. you must take at least 6 credit hours every semester/term)
- Must have and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

#### Some positions require:

- Ability to obtain and maintain a security clearance
- Medical exam, Drug Testing
- Driver's License
