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ERRATA

In Chapter 9, Table 9-3, Comparative Summary of BLM Allocations, an editing error occurred. The allocations listed in the table for fluid mineral leasing through lands and realty were copied over from Alternative A (No Action Alternative) in the Final EIS instead of from Alternative B (Proposed Plan). The correct allocations were listed, however, in the Approved RMP text in Section 9.2.2 of Chapter 9. Table 9-3 has been updated with correct numbers in red font on the next page and affects only the presentation of information shown in the table.

Text listed in NSO-4, CLS-I, and MM-I in Appendix A, has also been edited with red text to correct the language of the stipulations. The text, as edited, was included and analyzed in the Final Joint EIS but was unintentionally omitted from Appendix A of the Record of Decision/Approved RMP.

¹Acreages subject to fluid minerals NSO and CSU stipulations may overlap; therefore, acreages do not add up to the mineral estate decision area. Under the Approved RMP, there are approximately 69,600 acres of overlap.

²NSO acreages for other SMAs are an estimate used for analysis purposes only; specific NSO stipulations will be determined by the SMA at the time of lease sale.

*Plus any applicable Federal lands within the bed of the Red River along an approximately 116-mile stretch between the North Fork of the Red River and the 98th Meridian and between the south bank and median line of the Red River that will be more specifically identified and mapped when they are surveyed. (No exact acreages of Federal lands are available at this time because the full 116-mile stretch has not been surveyed.) Any such survey would be conducted in accordance with applicable law.

No acreage figures have been provided here. Refer to **Appendix N of the FEIS for legal land descriptions of isolated tracts of public land, as well as certain lands in the Cross Bar Management Area, which the BLM has identified as meeting the disposal criteria in section 203 of FLPMA. Prior to any decision to dispose of public land, the BLM would review the legal land description and conduct a resurvey, if necessary. For lands within the bed of the Red River along an approximately 116-mile stretch between the North Fork of the Red River and the 98th Meridian and between the south bank and median line of the Red River, such lands would be more specifically identified and mapped when they are surveyed. (No exact acreages and no legal land descriptions of Federal lands are available at this time because the full 116-mile stretch has not been surveyed.) Any such survey would be conducted in accordance with applicable law.

NSO-4	Proposed	Riparian-Wetland Areas and Waterbodies	NSO	<p>Stipulation: All or portions of the lands under this lease contain wetland-riparian areas and/or waterbodies. Riparian-wetland areas and waterbodies include but are not limited to perennial, ephemeral, or intermittent streams; springs, seeps, lakes, ponds, reservoirs, and playas.</p> <p>No surface occupancy is allowed within these areas and within an area that begins and extends up to 415 feet landward from the outside edge of the riparian-wetland area or waterbody, as determined by the BLM biologist prior to any surface-disturbing activities.</p> <p>Purpose: Manage surface water and groundwater quality to maintain, improve, or restore the chemical, physical, and biological function of water resources.</p> <p>Exception: An exception may be granted if the lessee can demonstrate and the NEPA analysis has determined that there would be no adverse impacts on the natural hydrology and geomorphology associated with the wetland-riparian area and/or waterbody.</p> <p>Modification: A modification may be granted if it is determined that a portion of the area does not qualify as a riparian-wetland area or waterbody, or if scientific research indicates that a lesser or more restrictive buffer is appropriate for managing these riparian-wetland/waterbody areas.</p> <p>Waiver: A waiver may be granted if it is determined that the entire riparian-wetland area or waterbody does not qualify as a riparian-wetland area or waterbody, or if scientific research indicates that a buffer is not necessary for managing these riparian-wetland/waterbody areas.</p>
