Before making the request, I personally researched the tribe's reputation with community, parish, and state government. I read their oral history; and I personally visited and toured their tribal land. While there, I visited the historical sites that were mentioned in their oral history.

To say that I was impressed with the tour of BTBB lands would be an understatement. I have worked with many Native American tribes (State & Federal) within the State of Louisiana, BTBB was the only tribe that could take me to the exact locations mentioned in their oral history.
